1:00 - 4:30 **Firestopping Basics for Long Term Care**

In this part of the program, Eric Reed of Poole Fire Prevention will be presenting the basics of firestopping and will focus on containment in construction, how firestopping is tested, the systems approach to selecting the proper firestopping application and inspection techniques of installed firestopping. He will also address specific code requirements and how to apply and manage them in long term care facilities.

Presenter: Eric Reed, Poole Fire Protection graduated with a degree in Fire Protection and Safety Engineering Technology. He holds a NICET Level II in Fire Alarm. Mr. Reed is responsible for providing fire protection engineering design services, facility assessments and code consulting at Poole Fire Protection. His project tasks include inspection of new and existing facilities for compliance with minimum design standards, design, construction management and acceptance testing of fire alarm and fire suppression systems. He has also provided training for the Kansas State Fire Marshal's Office on fire-stopping.
