The process by which individuals move from hospitals to nursing homes and other care settings is increasingly problematic as hospitals shorten lengths of stay and as care becomes more fragmented. Medicare patients report greater dissatisfaction related to discharges than to any other aspect of care that CMS measures. This situation can be changed. Improved health care processes at and after discharge correlate with substantial reductions in the incidence of pressure ulcers, and early rehospitalization for particular conditions. Learn about the latest work in this area, what Kansas providers say, and what we can all do to help accelerate improvement.
